We're aware that a small number of students continue to be affected by unpunctual bus services, and we want you to know that we're actively working with Lincolnshire County Council to resolve these issues. If your child is late due to a bus delay, please contact us via attendance@havenhigh.net or the MyEd app. Tell us which bus route they were on, which bus stops they used, and the times they got on and off. We'll then remove any late detention for your child. This information helps us build a strong case when working with the local authority to improve the service

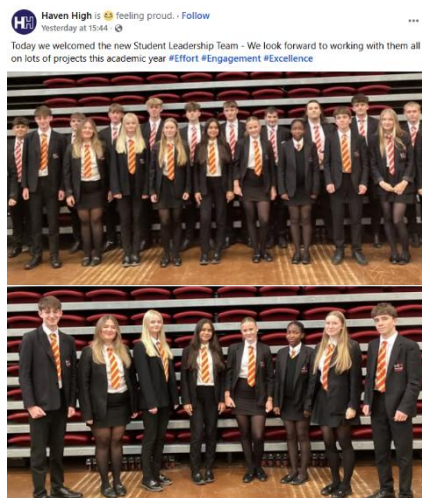
